**Dustin:** Thank you!

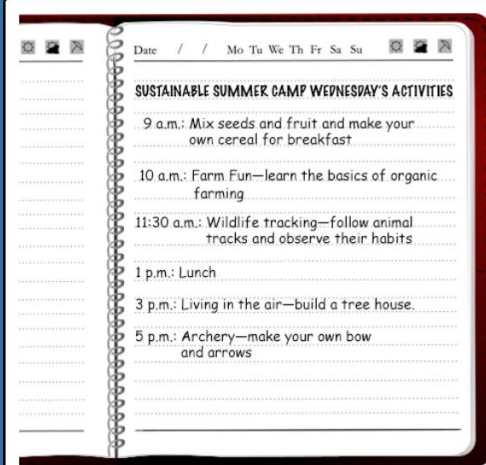
